Third Friday Art Walk

The event features over 60 businesses plus local cuisine, live music and more – making it the perfect Friday night out for locals and their visiting friends and family this summer.

Walkabout Tremont

Summer means the return of Blossom Music Center and a number of opportunities to experience the venue in the heart of Cuyahoga Valley National Park. The Cleveland Orchestra calls the venue home during the summer months and has 14 shows on the calendar before Labor Day including performances of music from The Lord of The Rings and Mozart in the Meadows. Rock, pop and hip-hop fans are in luck with performers including Foreigner, 50 Cent and 5 Seconds of Summer all set to take the stage between now and the end of summer.
