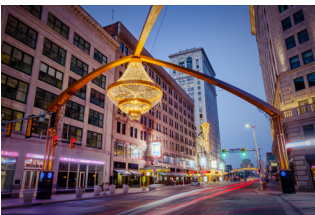
Evening:

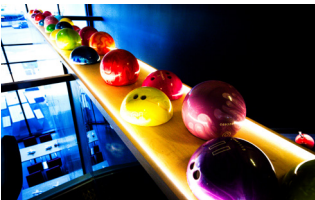
Afternoon:
